## Sea Trail Missions

"We will cross any sea and blaze all trails to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world."

Down a long and winding road named Central Ave. in Summerville, South Carolina sits a small church with a big heart and a passion for missions. Seven days a week, there is always someone, doing something, at Knightsville Global Methodist Church to help the Least, Lost and Lonely of this world.

In June of 2024, 12 members of Hope Mission Ministries journeyed together on a Honduras Mission Trip as they traveled to La Entrada de Copan, Honduras in conjunction with Youth for Christ in bringing the gospel to children in public schools.

Not to be outdone, Pa's Pantry at Knightsville works in partnership with the Charleston Lowcountry Food Bank in a bi-monthly partnership distribution to support the Summerville community. In 2024, Knightsville served over 6,000 participants with 40,000 pounds of food with the help of 30 plus volunteers.



With missions in mind, our Thanksgiving Community Fellowship is always an overwhelming success. With the assistance of 175 volunteers, we fed 3,038 deep fried turkey dinners to the local community in 2024. Since 2015 we have witnessed and served in excess of 15,000 Thanksgiving meals to our community.



As children all over town began thinking about the new school year ahead, KMC provided 72 backpacks and school supplies to Knightsville and Reeves elementary schools. A Blessing of the Backpacks was held during a Sunday morning worship service before the start of the school year. This support of children in need has been a yearly mission since 2018.

In partnership with Seacoast Church and the Summerville Homeless Initiative, KMC has provided all the meals to the local homeless shelter (December 2023 through February 2025). We have surpassed serving over 5,000 dinner/breakfast meals to our homeless "friends and neighbors" in the low country community.

Each year at Christmas KMC brings much happiness to the children/youth residents of the Pineland Home for Children as we provide pajamas and hygiene products to over 40 residents. This year was our 25<sup>th</sup> in "seeing this need and meeting that need."

This year, KMC shared in the "Holiday of Joy" as we supported Hurricane Helene victims from the Asheville, NC public school program with over \$10,000 in children's clothing, hygiene products, handmade quilts and numerous other items.

Our participation in Samaritan's Purse/Operation Christmas Child gives us the opportunity to serve children around the world with shoeboxes filled with small items that show our love for those little ones who may not receive anything else during the Christmas season. We donated 84 boxes in November of 2024.

Our Plastic Mat Ministry was started in November of 2024. Volunteers can flatten bags, cut bags, roll balls of plarn (plastic yarn), crochet or do all four parts. Mats are then donated to the homeless, helping them to have something to place between them and the ground as they sleep wherever they can find a resting spot. Five mats were presented to be blessed at church in December of 2024.

Never to be ignored or overlooked, our Community Computer Ministry surpassed our 600<sup>th</sup> donated refurbished laptop this past year. In supplying a muchneeded computer for a family in April 2020, this ministry has been such a blessing to people of all ages. We expanded this mission by offering a KMC Computer 101 community class to beginners. That created a monster, ha-ha, new email accounts for seniors have exploded in Summerville!



Known as *"the most loving place in town,"* Knightsville Global Methodist is indeed a mission minded church that is passionate in their mandate that a "see a need and meet a need" opportunities in serving God are always on the horizon while making disciples of Jesus Christ.

# Did you Know?

We love Spring and all the fresh flowers growing in our yards. We look forward to Easter too and possibly a beautiful Sunrise Service and celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus from the tomb. We sing: *Christ the Lord is Risen Today.* Easter is the most important Holy Day of the church calendar year, and we celebrate. *He Lives! He Lives!* 

However, to deeply appreciate new life and the power of the Resurrection we must pause to reflect on the Crucifixion. We cannot skip over what happened on a day we call **Good Friday**. You may have heard the expression: *What was Good about Good Friday*?

A summary of answers will include: In Christianity, "Good Friday" is considered "good" because it marks the day of Jesus Christ's crucifixion, which is seen as the ultimate act of sacrifice and love, paving the way for the hope of the resurrection on Easter Sunday, signifying the victory over death and sin, and offering salvation to humanity through God's grace; despite the suffering involved, it is considered a positive event due to the greater good it represents.

So, this brings up what we will be doing on Good Friday here at KMC. We are offering a worship service called: The Stations of the Cross. When we visit the Holy Land next year we will walk part of the Via Dolorosa.

This Way of the Cross is a modern adaptation of an old Christian tradition dating back to the fifth century. The fourteen traditional Stations of the Cross mark the passages from the moment Jesus was condemned to death until his burial in the tomb. The Way of the Cross was originally used by Christian pilgrims to the Holy Land, and it came to be identified with the Lenten season to prepare the people of God for the season of repentance that Lent represents.

All scripture used in our outside service on April 18<sup>th</sup> at 7 pm is biblically based. Participants will have the opportunity to carry the Cross. The Way of the Cross is a service whereby the people of KMC can reflect on the meaning that the sacrifice by Jesus has in their daily lives. It is a means of grace and rededication of ourselves to Christ as His disciples. An opportunity to go Deeper!

This devotional service will to help the people of God — through Scripture, prayer, and reflection — relive the experience of suffering and sacrifice that our Lord went through on Good Friday over two thousand years ago.

The Way of the Cross also helps to bring back the meaning of Holy Week and make it truly a significant period for all Christians. It will help us to fully appreciate Easter Sunday when we once again sing: *Christ the Lord is Risen Today!*



## Becoming Disciples Through Bible Study

The goal of Disciple 1 is to develop disciples for Jesus Christ who know and love God's Word. Throughout this study, you will be reading Scripture. As you read it, take notes and write down your reflections and/ or questions in your manual. Daily assignments will guide you in reading the Bible, your manual, and preparing you for your next group get together.

#### Coming in 2025, Transformational Small Groups!

#### What is a Transformational Small Group?

A "Transformational Small Group" takes place in a small group setting, designed to facilitate significant personal growth and spiritual development among its members through deep sharing, accountability, and intentional focus on applying teachings to daily life, leading to meaningful life changes and a closer relationship with God; it goes beyond just studying information to actively cultivate transformation in individuals within the group.

Key points about Transformational Small Groups:

•Deep relationships- Members build strong connections with each other, fostering a safe space for vulnerability and honest sharing.

•Active participation- Emphasis on applying teachings to personal situations and actively reflecting on how to live out faith in daily life.

•Accountability- Group members hold each other accountable for their commitments and spiritual growth.

•Leader focus- Leaders are trained to guide meaningful discussions and encourage personal reflection.

•Kingdom-oriented- Focus on how to live out faith in service to others and advancing God's kingdom



The wait is over! I am blessed beyond belief to announce to you that a new small group experience at Knightsville Methodist Church is ready to launch. You have been hearing about it for several months and now we are finally ready to begin to form groups.

First, let me give you a brief introduction. The name says it all. Going Deeper, because we seek believers who have a desire to go deeper in many aspects of their relationship with Jesus Christ and others in their small group of fellow believers. The TLC part of the name is a catchy way to describe what happens to a group participant as they "Go Deeper." They begin to experience TLC that is "Transforming our Lives through Christ" as a byproduct of meeting weekly to pray for the Holy Spirit to come and join them as each member of the group has a "Sharing The Faith" moment. While sharing your faith with each other you will talk with each other about your daily and regular Acts of Piety, that keep you centered on God's Word. You will share and hear about specific events and times from the past week where you felt the presence of Christ walking beside you in your life. You will share, and hear about encounters where you had the opportunity to be God's beacon of hope for somebody. In addition, you will share how you and the others feel that your faith has been tested. Individually you will declare and hear from others about their plan for study and action for the coming week, in order to see our lives through the lens of Christ. Finally, the group will intimately share prayer requests, concerns and praises. Sounds a little different, right? This may sound intimidating to some, but don't discount the transformational power of developing close knit bonds with other believers and hearing that we all have the same fears, trials and tribulations. There is something miraculously transforming when you hear stories from others as they recall times from their week where they encountered a situation or event where they felt the closeness of Christ. You will begin to look for and note these occurrences in your own lives, just so you can share at the next small group meeting. And as you transform, your group members will transform. And as the groups transform, our church will begin to transform as well.

Well, are you ready to blast off with us?
