#### **RIGHT HERE, RIGHT NOW**

One of John Wesley's absolutes was that a person's road to righteousness was totally dependent on the grace of God. He held firm that our ability to become righteous had nothing to do with ourselves but only through the presence of the Holy Spirit working in and through the lives of Disciples of Jesus Christ. It is through God's Spirit that we are constantly being shaped, molded, and transformed into His likeness. Becoming like Jesus is a long, slow process of growth. Growing into righteousness is a gradual process and will take the rest of our lives. In Paul's letter to the church of Ephesus he emphasized that our spiritual journey *"will continue until we are...mature, just as Christ is, and we will be completely like him."* (Ephesians 4:13) Wesley contended that we can be vessels that bear the love of God to the world and share the treasures of his grace only if the vessel of our soul is *daily refilled*, only if we feed upon our daily bread that is the manna of grace.

"The Lord has made everything for his own purpose." (Proverbs 16:4 The Living Bible) And he chose us to be his very own, joining us to himself even before he laid the foundation of the universe! Because of his great love, he ordained us, so that we would be seen as holy in his eyes with an unstained innocence. For it was always in his perfect plan to adopt us as his delightful children, through our union with Jesus, the Anointed One, so that his tremendous love that cascades over us would glorify his grace—for the same love he has for his Beloved One, Jesus, he has for us. And this unfolding plan brings him great pleasure! (Ephesians 1:4-6 The Passion Translation) In essence, God's purpose in creating us was to love us! Such clarity of purpose and integration of energy and effort is the reason for our mission of Right Here, Right Now!

Right Here, Right Now is an intentional pattern of spiritual disciplines that provide structure and direction for growth in holiness. If we truly want to grow in our relationship with the creator of the world, we need to take an inventory of our current walk as it is now, for better or worse. Making the tough decisions is required of our time to intentionally move towards a deeper experience of communion with God. Our growing process is wholly dependent upon the spiritual practices that we incorporate into our daily lives. As with all spiritual practices, the real question is what gives you more life, abundant life! God prescription is for us to live a well-ordered life – faithful and fruitful. Spiritual Disciplines are simply practices that train us in faithfulness. Our obedience to listen to God will produce a faithful life, will develop a fruitful life, and exemplify a life lived for God! A commitment to a rule of life allows God's love to make us real! In Paul's letter to the Romans, he calls out where our true obedience needs to rest;

"Only those people who are led by God's Spirit are his children." (Romans 8:14 Contemporary English Version)

Author, Steve Macchia, encourages that we need to "get in touch with the real God, inviting the true me, to be in relationship with him, and live fully for Him in every aspect of our life." But seriously, how many of us go through life developing the due diligence it requires getting fully in touch with God? "How many of us know our own limits? I suspect few of us know either our true limitations or capabilities, because we have not really tested ourselves in full reliance on God's grace. Few of us preserve patiently in our spiritual practices until they yield their deepest gifts. In our increasingly "quick fix" culture we want virtue without labor, transformation without effort, and new life without dying. In search of reaching our greatest potential in living in communion with God we need to come to grasp with the "stops" and "starts" that will be necessary for us to experience God's overall purpose in our lives.

Bottom-line there are two questions that we need to address to fully develop a personal commitment to **Right Here, Right Now**: What do I need to stop in life? What do I need to start in my life? What are those obstacles that need to stop that keep me separated from experiencing the greater love of Christ? What are those starts that need to be initiated that will open up my soul to experience the absolute Holy Mystery of God's love? What ways of prayer, silence, and solitude will allow God to penetrate me in a most powerful way? What spiritual practices will be inviting for me to grow into a more intimate relationship that will continuously challenge me to be completely honest with God?

The great theologian, Thomas á Kempis writes, "All cannot use the same kind of spiritual exercises, but one suits this person, and another that." And the key is giving the Spirit time and space to rearrange our interior furniture – setting our disordered priorities and putting love of God and neighbor center stage." In taking an inventory (honest assessment) of our current walk with God, we need to identify the various components of our 24/7 daily lives that consumes us.

**Right Here, Right Now** is individualistic. Martin Buber recounts the comment of an old Hasidic rabbi named Zusya just before his death: "In the world to come, they will not ask me: why were you not Moses? They will ask me: Why were you not Zusya?" In discovering one's purpose we can be created, redeemed, and transformed by God and God alone. "When you pursue this awareness within the community, he's graciously provided for you, then the tide of renewal will come for all who join hearts and hands in this way.

How important is this: What is at stake is the reach of our spiritual maturity, the authenticity of our leadership in the church. Above all, Spiritual maturity is characterized by the love of others according to the New Commandment in John 13, "You shall love others as you have first been loved." In Christ, we have all been loved with a true sacrificial love that was given up for us, so we could all experience eternity. This example is what is expected of us as Disciples of Jesus. As he commanded us to do: Love the Lord your God with all your heart, mind, and your soul; and love your neighbor as yourself. Sounds like a good starting point to developing a personal "**Right Here, Right Now**"!

Out of the Shadows "I know that my Redeemer lives, and that in the end He will stand upon the earth." ~ Job 19:25

The year 1741 was a very depressing one for George Frideric Handel. His latest opera failed. His Italian opera company in London disbanded. That same year Queen Caroline passed away and the commissions Handel had received for composing music for royal occasions all but dried up. A stroke experienced several years prior not only affected Handel physically, but affected his music also. It seemed as if he had lost the genius that made his music so popular.

Late that year Charles Jennens, a poet known by few, sent Handel a manuscript with a request that Handel set it to music. When Handel read the copy, the words gripped him. Suddenly he came alive! Immediately he began to put the words to music. He labored all through that night and much of the following day. In fact, he worked day and night for 22 more days, barely stopping to eat or sleep.

When his composition was finished, he sensed that it would be a true masterpiece. His Messiah was performed the following year and was an immediate success.

The words that Jennens wrote that inspired Handel and lifted him out of the pit of despair were about the Savior: "He was despised and rejected by men. He looked for someone to have pity on him, but there was no man. He trusted in God. God did not leave his soul in hell. I know that my Redeemer lives. Rejoice. Hallelujah!"

If you are in a time of despair or just a bit stressed out because of a life situation, the Stephen Ministry can help. We can listen. We can pray with you. We cannot solve your problem, but we can "be there" for you and support you as you work to resolve whatever it is that life has thrown at you.

"Has anyone ever shared this with you before?"

A question I often ask when I get to share the gospel with people, but it was the first time I had gotten this response:

"No I don't think I've ever heard this before"

That was what Mikel, an exchange student from Germany, said as we finished sharing the gospel with him. That day Mikel did not accept Jesus as his Lord; but he did walk away with an obvious curiosity, a newly downloaded bible app, and directions from myself and my partner that day to start in the book of John.

Over the two and a half weeks I spent on summer mission in Poland I got to meet all kinds of students. Some like Mikel who had never heard the gospel, others who were involved in their Cru movements on campus in Poland, and many who had been raised in the catholic church but for one reason or another did not hold to a faith in Jesus. Polish students were welcoming, surprisingly open about their lives, and obviously spiritually hungry.

On another day another staff member and I were almost two hours late to our picnic outreach because we were following up with a student. She had come to our outreach event the night before and had lots of questions about who we were, why were in Poland, and most importantly what we believed.

In two weeks of ministry between two cities we ended up having: 227 Spiritual conversations 165 Gospel conversations and saw 5 students place their faith in Jesus!

These few stories are just a glimpse at the ways we saw the Lord work over our time in Poland. I could probably write another 10 pages on everything else that happened and if you would like to hear more please give me a phone call or ask next time I get to see you! Most importantly thank you for your prayers, for the gifts you gave that made it possible for me to be on this trip, and the many ways you all continue to support this ministry the Lord has called me to.

This ministry doesn't happen without you.
