#### Faith - Family - Fellowship

So, let me ask:

#### "Are You Living Courageously in the Moment?"

As we head into the start of a new school year there are so many activities and distractions for us to immerse our lives into this "chaotic" world in which we live. Going here, going there, going everywhere consumes us and we sometimes need to just stop and listen for God's spirit to direct us to places of silence and solitude.

Over the past years, I've encouraged you to "go deeper" as a disciple for Jesus Christ. The church successfully launched into "small groups" during the past year. Let me encourage you to join or start a group during this season of your life. Reach out to Doug Hammond or the church office for more information.

A few years ago I preached on the article: **What Happened To The Huddle**. During this season of football madness (high school, college and pros) allow this perspective from Hall of Famer, Roger Staubach to resonate within you the greater need to "go deeper" and find places of silence and solitude which will give you a clearer picture and answers to: "How's Your Life Going?"

#### WHAT HAPPENED TO THE HUDDLE

When you think about the game of football, there are many images and words that come to mind, but one of the most distinct elements of the sport has always been the "huddle."

Before every play, teams circle up to discuss the next play and secretly make adjustments, while also challenging and encouraging each other to win the game.

Even as a kid playing backyard football with my brothers and friends, I always enjoyed huddling up and getting ready to try and score a touchdown.

Putting our arms on each others' shoulders created a sense of teamwork, as we strategized on how to make a big play. Then saying "ready break" in unison made it even more exciting!

As important as the huddle has been for so many years (beginning in the 1890s), there is a trend that shows teams are going away from huddling up before each play.

The New York Times wrote an <u>article</u> about the disappearing huddle and explained it like this: "In the pursuit of more scoring, teams now employ some form of a hurry-up operating system aptly called the no-huddle offense. It is as it sounds, players darting from one play to the next."

We see quarterbacks making signals for the play call as they rush their guys to the line of scrimmage to quickly hike the ball. This makes sense for scoring more points and running more plays throughout the game, but something else may be getting lost.

Former Dallas Cowboys quarterback, Roger Staubach, gave this perspective in the article: "As players in the huddle, you're all alone in the middle of the field but together at the same time. You see who is hurt, who's tired or who's spitting mad. You can take that all in, which can be powerful."

I'm in agreement with Staubach's take on the huddle, and concerned that the fast-paced nature of football has also infiltrated our own lives. Instead of "huddling up" like we should, we are like "players darting from one play to the next" and not slowing down to put our arms around each other.

When we take the time to circle up with our friends, however, we can actually "see who is hurt" or "who's tired" or "who's spitting mad."

As followers of Jesus, it's crucial that we pause to encourage and challenge one another to keep going...discuss the "next play"...and work together to keep winning.

We are missing out on a lot in our lives when we run the "no-huddle" by not fellowshipping or gathering or circling up with each other.

Hebrews 10:24-25 (AMP) puts it this way: "Let us consider thoughtfully how we may encourage one another to love and to do good deeds, not forsaking our meeting together as believers for worship and instruction, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another; and all the more faithfully as you see the day of Christ's return approaching."

Today as we think about Staubach's powerful description of a football huddle, let's embrace finding our own huddles...and closely follow Jesus together.

## Staying Rooted in the Word A Letter from the Road James 1:19–25 (NIV)

Greetings from the road! As many of you know, Susan and I are currently on a 90-day journey across the United States and parts of Canada, taking in the incredible beauty of God's creation—from majestic mountains to quiet lakes, from bustling cities to peaceful forests. Every day offers something new, and we're deeply grateful for this time of rest and renewal.

And yet, I want to be honest with you—staying consistent in my daily time in the Word has been a challenge. The change in routine, the ever-shifting pace of travel, and the simple distractions of the road have made it harder than I expected. I've had to stop and ask myself: Is my time with God drawing me closer to Him in joy and transformation—or has it become rushed, routine, or even neglected at times?

James 1:22 says, "Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says." This Scripture reminds us that the Word is not just meant to be read—it's meant to change us. Verses 23 –25 compare those who hear but don't respond to someone looking in a mirror and walking away, forgetting what they saw. But the one who "looks intently" and continues in it will be blessed.

So, wherever you are in your own devotional walk—strong, struggling, or somewhere in between—I want you to know: I understand. Let's not be discouraged. Let's lean in again. Here are a few ways that I've found helpful on this journey:

- Change the pace: Read a shorter passage and sit with it longer.
- Pray Scripture aloud: Let the Word become your prayer.
- Reflect daily: Ask, "What is one way I can live this out today?"
- Stay accountable: Share what God is showing you with a friend or small group.

Look for transformation, not completion: The goal isn't to "finish" the Bible—it's to become more like Jesus.

Let's keep pressing on—trusting that even small, faithful steps in the Word can lead to lasting change. I'm walking this journey too, and I'm praying for you as you grow in delight and devotion to our Lord.

#### A Place For You

Yes, you! Knightsville Methodist Church has *a place for you* in one of our small groups. The invitation is always open. All you need to do is say yes. Come and join us as we grow in Christian fellowship and love. You won't be disappointed.

Some of you may be asking what, exactly, is a small group? A small group is a gathering of people who interact and influence one another with the goal of achieving a common purpose or task. In Scripture, a clear example of a small group was Jesus and His twelve disciples. Jesus could handle twelve people in a group, but here at Knightsville we like to keep our groups smaller in size, usually around six - eight people. The smaller size of the groups allow for more personal connections and deeper discussions. In smaller groups, members are more likely to share their ideas and thoughts. Small groups can also foster a sense of a loving community and teamwork.

Spiritually driven small groups give us a more personable environment to mature in our Christian faith and live out our daily lives with Jesus as the center. They will also increase your desire to be the "hands and feet" of Christ in this world. I am reminded of a song I love called "How Beautiful." Its words resound often in my head, "How beautiful the hands that served the wine and the bread, and the sons of the earth, how beautiful is the body of Christ."

Why, you might ask, would I want to get involved in yet another group? Many ask that question. Those who can give you the best answer are those who have been blessed by being in a small group. Over the next few weeks we will be talking about the importance our "Going Deeper" small groups and how they have the power to transform your life.





Knightsville Women in Christ will resume meeting in September. We're looking for new members. Please come and join us one the times listed below.


The Morning Glory Circle will meet in the Steve Miller Conference Room at 10 am, Tuesday, September 9th. Anna Speakman is the circle leader.

This 24-week study immerses you in the Old Testament (12 weeks -2025) and the New Testament (12 weeks - 2026). This study provides a great survey of the entire Bible. It is so important to have a solid base in the Old Testament in order to develop a full understanding of the New Testament, how God prepared Israel for the Messiah, and how Jesus fulfilled the Old Testament prophecies.

We will be "walking together" in this study with our friends from Summerville Methodist Church. Marc Jacques will be leading this upcoming fall session of the Old Testament. The plan is to have Marc and Pastor Bill (morning session) to lead us in the New Testament in 2026.

So in those dark hours when you lose your way, a Stephen Minister can just be with you, not to rescue you, but to be your companion, to hold your hand until the dawn arrives and you remember your own strength. It's a special kind of love that helps you remember who you are, even when you forget.


