### Candle of Peace

December 7, 2025

Today we celebrate the Second Sunday in the Season of Advent. We light the **Candle of Peace**. God's **peace** transcends all understanding in our world of uncertainty. May his **peace** guide and direct you for the coming days ahead.

Today we light the second candle with the absolute belief as its written in the 1<sup>st</sup> Chapter in the Book of Luke.

The following month God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a village in Galilee, to a virgin, Mary, engaged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of King David. Gabriel appeared to her and said, "Congratulations, favored lady! The Lord is with you! Confused and disturbed, Mary tried to think what the angel could mean. "Don't be frightened, Mary," the angel told her, "for God has decided to wonderfully bless you! Very soon now, you will become pregnant and have a baby boy, and you are to name him 'Jesus.'
